Currently we have two that are coming consistently, my brother-in-law Milt Warrell and brother Derrick Miller. Brothers Amos Bellah and Richard Joploh have come intermittently. Please pray for this effort.
- Milt Warrell: Along with coming to the Homiletics class, Milt is taking Amridge University courses online to earn a Bachelors in Bible. I am excited for him because I know it's something he had always wanted to do. Initially, when he first obeyed the gospel my brother Joe encouraged him to attend Bear Valley.
