
Missions in Media Update - July 2017

Concerning NEIE:

- The Northeast Institute of Evangelism is now in its fourth year of operation with four formal students, and five auditing this quarter. Intro to Biblical Hermeneutics is the current course.
- Two students graduated in December of 2015 Issac Prince and William Anderson.
 William is a member at Media, and has become more active in leadership, helping in our worship leading songs, and with outreach. Issac Prince is working with a sister congregation, the Chester Church of Christ in Upland, PA. He is very active evangelizing and helping with pulpit duties once a month. He also teaches Sunday morning classes.
- Two students graduated in December of 2016 Amos Bellah and Kenneth Spence. Amos is a member at Media, and Kenneth is now serving as the pulpit evangelist in Camden, NJ. Amos has been helping to preach from time to time at Media, and is

growing in his ability to serve in other areas. He preached at the Northeast Philadelphia Church of Christ the third Sunday this past month.

- Mark Eckler, William Anderson, and Amos Bellah flew with me (June of 2016) to work in Shawnee, OK on the annual Back to the Bible Campaign that is run by the Northwest Church of Christ, Lawton, OK. Mark is a formal student, and a new member at Media. Amos was a formal student at NEIE and also a member at Media. The results: twenty-two were immersed and two restored. Brother Joe Curtis (a brother from the Shawnee congregation) reported in June of this year that a man had visited with them who had a brochure placed on his door a year ago, and he finally got around to reading it...he said that he wanted to be baptized! During our Back to the Bible campaigns we leave two brochures on every door, one is about the campaign and the offer to study, another is the actual study. Amen...you just never know (cf. Heb. 12:4; Eph. 6:17).
- Back to the Bible Campaign in Media & Chester In (July of 2016) we worked together with twenty plus members from Waterview (students and a few adults); more than several members from the Chester congregation and Media. Through this effort we invited folks to hear a series of lessons delivered by brother Tyrone Harris on the need for Godly Fathers in the Home. Forty plus contacts were established, most being in Chester. My son Nicholas was baptized the week after the campaign was held. Chester had two that obeyed immediately following the campaign, although not directly related to the outreach in the Chester community, the fire that developed during the effort helped two previous studies turn into baptisms. Eileen Beotheny and Jada Lawrence were baptized into Christ. Eileen is now a formal student at NEIE! The study with Jada came through Eileen! Eileen is growing in her evangelistic efforts already, and prayerfully will be working on next year's campaign in Oklahoma. Contacts from this work are still being followed up on!
- June 2017 Campaign in Lawton, OK My son Nicholas (16 yrs.) and brother Fred Brown traveled with me to Lawton, OK for the Back to the Bible Campaign. This year the Northwest congregation hosted the campaign. The latest results: forty-three baptisms and four restorations. The follow-up obviously is tremendous. Please keep NW in your prayers as they work with the new members grounding them in the faith. Fred came back on fire and decided that he wanted to be more involved at home in Media. He said, "After doing this work I realize how much more I should be doing to help you with Media." He went on to say that he wanted to do some door-knocking. We sent out the latest July-August issue of House to House and will be following up going door to door on Saturday, August 6th. Pray for our efforts. GO Fred...remember the school motto – Go As You Grow...Grow As You Go!
- Northeast Philadelphia interested in utilizing students The northeast congregation had recently contacted me about helping with the pulpit there. The brother Hubbard is

having some health issues and could use a hand from time to time. Brother Amos Bellah preached for the first time outside of Media at NE and did a great job, so they said. Issac Prince may be lending a hand soon, depending on his schedule at Chester.

- **NEIE Website soon to be launched** It has been a long time coming, prayerfully the site will be up with more to complete as time moves on...will send notice to all when it's up.
- Brother Monte and Sister Cheryl Ginnings Sister Ginnings was invited to speak at the annual Lower Bucks Church of Christ Ladies Day in Levittown, PA. I invited brother Monte to come and teach at the school in Media while Cheryl spoke in Levittown. The dynamic duo did an excellent job! Cheryl spoke on "Christian Living" and from what I hear from the ladies, was very encouraging. Monte taught a class on sermon preparation for several of the men—Issac Prince, William Anderson, Amos Bellah, Fred Brown, and I were grateful to hear very practical teaching from one who has spent many years in the pulpit. Currently we are working on remodeling a room at the end of our lobby, turning it into a training/nursery room.
