NEIE—Sixth Year of Operation:

- The Northeast Institute of Evangelism is now in its sixth year of operation with six formal students, and two auditing this quarter. Presently we're in our third quarter, second year of the two year program—Introduction to Hermeneutics.

- Home Mission Workshop: In late March Derrick, Regina, Eileen and I traveled to Wichita Falls, TX for the Home Mission Workshop held at the Faith Village Church of Christ. It was a shot in the arm that all of us needed! A great time to encourage and be encouraged in the way of evangelism and missions with even more brethren attending this year than last. All of the classroom sessions and lessons delivered from the pulpit were excellent. Many expressed their desire to return next year.
